**RE: Scofieldtown Landfill (Stamford) Closure Project
Consent Order Number SRD-205**

On September 10, 2010, the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection (CTDEP) and the City of Stamford (City) entered into a Consent Order (SRD-205) that stipulated the requirements of immediate actions to be taken by the City with respect to the Scofieldtown former landfill.

As required in the Consent Order, Section B, Number 4, the City is submitting two (2) hard copies and one (1) electronic copy of the 1st Quarterly Off-Site Impact Evaluation Status Report (work performed April – June, 2012) which contains the monitoring well, sediment, surface and seep water sampling results. All sample analyses were performed in accordance with EPA Methods.

As per the 3/16/2012 meeting with your office, the City was requested to provide advanced notification of other activities being performed in connection with the landfill closure project. Below is an update of ongoing and upcoming activities at the Scofieldtown Landfill Closure Plan Site;

- The City has commenced the stock piling of borrow soils on site. The soils were tested and classified by TRC. Attached please find a drawing "Temporary Soil Stockpile" that identifies where soil stockpiles currently are and to be located in the future on the site, while composting leaf piles are in process of being removed.
- Additional surveying was done to locate and map the coordinates and elevations of stream gauges, surface water, seep and sediment sample points.

- The City has obtained a General Stockpile Permit from CT DEEP that permits up to 10,000 cubic yards of slightly impacted soils for underneath the cap to be stored on site. Currently, the City has stockpiled 2,878 cubic yards of the materials on site as EXIST. D areas shown on the attached Temporary Soil Stockpile Plan.

The City anticipates this Fall to receive additional 7,000 cubic yards of slightly impacted soils from a ConnDOT I-95 Norwalk project. These soils will be stockpiled in D areas. A field meeting was conducted on the site with ConnDOT to review this activity.

- The City has also currently made arrangements for stock piling of 5,000 – 8,000 cubic yards of clean soils to be used over the cap to be moved into the site this Fall. These clean soils will be stockpiled at C areas shown on the Temporary Soil Stockpile Plan.
- There are also two potential other sources for obtaining another 10,000 cubic yards of clean fill from each source, pending TRC's approval of the test results.
- From October 20 to November 11, 2012, the recycling center area and the compost pick-up area will temporarily be closed to set up operations for a leaf transfer station. From November 12 to December 3, 2012, the City Solid Waste Division has made arrangements for the City Highway Division to only drop off leaves collected. A private contractor will then load the leaves into dump trailers. The City does not anticipate further composting of new leaves at the site.
- The City is expecting the final 2nd Quarterly Off-Site Impact Evaluation Status Report for testing performed during July – September, 2012 by the 1st week of November, 2012.


