 - Education forums, Race Relations, Ferguson Library for space and mailing list

Old Business:

- Development of Multicultural Calendar
 - Stamford Citywide All About Education Day – Secured the Stamford Innovation Center for February 28, 2015; All educational organizations host a table incorporating all cultures, age groups
 - Multicultural Learning Activity – Creating opportunities that eliminate barriers around race and politics, watch and accept differences
 - Partner with the Ferguson Library and show the movie – The Color of Justice (Quentin will follow up)
 - Participate in the Civility in America Series through Sacred Heart University
- Need representation of the following groups – Muslim, Chinese, Polish, Russian and Ukrainian
- Mission Statement / Guidelines / Roles and Expectations will be further developed by Jere
- Monthly Worship – **November 8** – four members were present during the service to Seventh Day Adventis; **December 14** – St. Benedict at 10:00 – 11:00, **January 11** at Unitarian Universalist Congregation centered around a theme of Justice at 10:00, **February 8** – Bethany Stamford Church at 9:00 am, additional dates to be available
- Holiday Celebration – set for December 10, 2014 at Hampton Inn Hotel at 7:00 pm
- Another Children’s Parade recap from John; Approx. 300 people attended, children were given apple (donated by Shoprite), water (donated by Nestle), fish snacks (purchased by MMC); not enough activities for the children to participate in after the parade; timing was off, needs to possibly be scheduled in September instead of October, location should be changed, BOE need to be invited to sub-committee meeting by the Mayor; there was a lack of outreach activities. Some additional recommendations were move the festival to downtown, involve different ethnic communities in Stamford to increase participation, start planning in early 2015; preferably January, finalize the budget in March 2015 and do not permit changes. Jenefeness advised the council that she attended the Hispanic Advisory Committee of Greater Stamford (HACGS) monthly meeting and discovered that they had great attendance for the Health Fair event they hosted on the same day as the Children’s Parade (October 18). They reported that approximately 1000 people attended; 663 via registration and the remainder as unregistered. They provided the following free tests/exams to the community
- The meeting became combative when John raised his voice, continuously cut people off and accessed blame for the events that occurred during the Children’s Parade. After which, Jere presented the letter (below) to the council for review.

Dear Mayor Martin,

I write this letter to inform you of a situation that happened on Saturday, October 18, 2014 during the set-up for the Mayor's Children Parade and International Festival.

At approximately 8am I asked John Mallozzi for a hardcopy of the parade route. His response was "nothing changed and you have a copy; stop the bullshit". He repeated bullshit several times in the presence of my eight year old niece, twelve year old nephew and thirteen year old neighbor's son. When I asked him to not to use profanity in the presence of youth, he again stated "bullshit and that it was not a bad word". Robert Figueroa then stated "John, it is a bad word" and at that point John covered his mouth, laughed and stopped swearing.

Later during the set-up, I discovered that there was not any sound equipment set-up for the planned start location of the parade and requested that the start be moved to allow the use of the stage and sound equipment. At that point John started yelling and cussing. I told him that I would talk with him if he stopped yelling which lead to him grabbing my arm. He went on to yell at me "you are nothing". When I would not respond he then ripped the tape roll that I was holding out of my hand. Seconds later, he offered it back to me, which I in turn asked him to hand it to the operations worker who was standing near us. Once I received the tape roll I walked away.

Given the physical and verbal abuse demonstrated by John Mallozzi, I am requesting that he be removed from the Mayor's Multicultural Council of Stamford.

If I am assaulted by John Mallozzi in the future I will take legal action.
