

## **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

### **Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)**

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

The City of Stamford's Five Year Goals of the strategic plan for the use of HUD funds were advanced through CDBG and HOME activities carried out in 2015-2016 (YR41). Stamford's YR41 CDBG allocation was \$864,525 and its HOME allocation was \$352,393. The City received \$183,853 in HOME Program Income in YR41. 14.94% of the YR41 CDBG allocation was spent on Public Services, 16.82% for Administration, 31% was allocated to for Public Improvements, 6% for Economic Development and 28% for Housing.

The Consolidated Plan set strategies and goals for three major areas: public service to the most vulnerable, retain and develop LMI Housing and create sustainable livable neighborhoods. The City has made progress towards meeting its goals and objectives. For public service to the most vulnerable funds were used by the Shelter for the Homeless, Inc. for drop in and career development programs, Domestic Violence Crisis Center and the Sexual Assault Crisis Center offered programs for victims of domestic violence, The Food Bank provided food to shelters and food pantries, Inspirica, Inc. offered a life skills development program for homeless women, the Child Guidance Center and Kids in Crisis offered mental health services for low income and homeless youth. The Boys and Girls Club ran a summer camp for the children of low income families and IICONN offered legal assistance to low income immigrants. To retain and develop LMI Housing the City released CDBG funds to Pilgrim Towers, Inc. to complete their bathroom renovation project and to the Historic Neighborhood Preservation Program to provide design services. HOME funds (projects marked complete) helped two low income families renovate their homes, two families to purchase homes, and one nonprofit renovate 6 rental units. A number of HOME projects are underway. Efforts to create sustainable livable neighborhoods include the replacement of windows at the Child Care Learning Center, completion of an HVAC replacement project for the Boys and Girls Club, and work on 2 facilities providing transitional and emergency shelter operated by Domus Kids, Inc. and Inspirica, Inc. A number of public improvement projects were delayed due to weather and agency capacity issues. These challenges have been addressed.

The City's use of CDBG and HOME funds is consistent with the Continuum of Care's, operating as Opening Doors of Fairfield County (ODFC) emphasis on increased transitional and permanent supportive housing. Several service programs benefitting the homeless are funded, but significant funds are also invested in assuring transitional facilities remain viable. The City continues to work with one of the Continuum's members, Mutual Housing Association of Southwestern Connecticut, Inc. (MHA), a CHDO, to construct 6 units of supportive rental housing with the assistance of HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds. To create new affordable housing and replace units at Czeck Homes, the City

awarded HOME funds to Summer Place Development LLC.

**Assess how the jurisdiction’s use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.**

The jurisdiction's use of funds addresses the priorities and objectives in the plan and supports programs and services that benefit the most vulnerable members of our community - the homeless, victims of domestic violence, immigrants and the children of low income families. The provision of funds to benefit these populations reflects the priorities of the activities identified. HOME funds are used to create affordable housing opportunities and ensure the long-term viability of our existing stock of affordable housing. The number of persons assisted with public service activities other than low/moderate income housing benefit exceeds our expected goal. Public Services were initially expected to assist 100 persons; a strong case could be made that a number of public service beneficiaries recorded above may in fact be prevented from experiencing homelessness - although the program does not have that as a stated goal. For example the distribution of food by the Food Bank or prescription drugs by SilverSource may ensure a person has sufficient funds for a rent payment. In the category of affordable housing the actual number of units reported is lower than anticipated due to the slow process of a number of funded projects. Likewise the number of persons assisted in the non-housing community development category is lower than expected due to a number of slow moving projects. For HOME a number of projects are underway – 190 Stillwater Ave., 992 Summer St., Trinity, Stamford Metro Green III and NNI Bell Street LP. A number of these projects are expected to be marked as complete in the coming year.

### Narrative

Stamford has and continues to direct funds to areas known to be home to greater than 51% low income residents - Downtown (residential), the East Side, Waterside, West Side and South End; 100% of our CDBG and HOME funds are provided to documented eligible low income beneficiaries.

## Leveraging

**Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.**

CDBG awards are always a small portion of the total amount of funds required for any public service project. Subrecipients leverage CDBG funds from a variety of sources - private donations, State and other local funds. In each application agencies detail total project cost and identify sources of funds. For example the Child Guidance Center had an \$8,000 CDBG award which was part of a \$57,000 project with other funds from State grants, the United Way, private donations and fee revenue or Inspirica's women's life coach which had a CDBG award of \$17,250 combined with \$7,500 from Greenwich CDBG, \$11,500 in agency funds for a \$36,250 project. Public Improvement and Housing projects typically require subrecipients to contribute some funding to complete the project. HOME awards are often a very small percentage of a much larger project; however, due to the requirement to have all secured funds in hand we are seeing more projects where HOME will be 100% of the project. The City has a recorded match from prior Federal fiscal years in excess of the required match contribution. Local Linkage funds were loaned to Trinity Park Apts. LP to satisfy future match requirements. Trinity is estimated to cost \$8,323,000 with funds from HOME, City Linkage and the CT Housing Finance Authority. In the case of HOME rehabilitation loans the borrowers provided modest amounts of private capital to compete the projects. For the HOME downpayment loan borrowers secured private first mortgages.

Slower than expected activity on CDBG funded housing projects has hampered our progress to meeting our goals. HOME activities are under way but not reported because they are not complete. Nonprofit capacity, particularly CHDO capacity, the availability of sites for development and the number of restrictions associated with HOME continue to make it a challenging program to use.

**Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.**

HOME, especially CHDO projects will continue to be a challenge. The City will need to review the \$20,000 per unit limit for projects. CDBG applicants will be asked to provide additional evidence they are actually ready to bid a project when awarded funds.

## **CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)**

**Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:**

### **Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs**

The City participates in the Continuum of Care. As projects are presented to the City by CoC members, City representatives attempt to coordinate assistance as feasible from CDBG, HOME and City capital funds. For example, the City continues working with Mutual Housing Association (CHDO) and Laurel House to assist in development of 6 new supportive housing units on Fairfield Avenue. This project was reconfigured from homeownership supportive to rental, supportive housing. The City supported an application by the sponsors for Connecticut tax credit financing to permit phased construction of the new units. These funds were awarded. HOME funds have been committed (\$120,000) to renovate units that will be rented to people transitioning from homeless shelters/programs. Funds are provided to the Shelter for the Homeless, Inc. for a drop in program and a career program.

The City supports the specialists in homelessness, (Inspirica, Inc., the Shelter for the Homeless, Inc., ODFC) in their efforts to conduct annual homeless counts, and especially to establish a "one point" universal intake for homeless, which would assess needs and begin the shelter and counselor/resource referral process. CDBG funds were used to support a Day Drop In and Career Counseling program for the homeless, in addition to a life planning coach for the homeless at Inspirica. Funds were provided to support the mental health needs of homeless youth.

### **Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons**

The City works closely with Stamford's shelters to assure their buildings are maintained and improved to meet the needs of the sheltered, and that transitional housing opportunities are available. In YR41 funds were spent to renovate the bathroom at a youth shelter operated by Domus, and funds were spent to renovate the bathrooms and the building maintained by Inspirica, Inc. to offer women and families a shelter - as well as house a number of social service agencies providing needed support services. Inspirica's Franklin Street facility is a shelter/ living facility for families, an essential element of the Continuum concept of shelter. HOME funded projects that will result in transitional units are underway.

**Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections**

**programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs**

The City has assisted in creation and renovation of the transitional housing units critical to offering a stable housing opportunity to those who are homeless while providing counseling for development of skills necessary to obtain permanent housing and maintain continued occupancy of that housing. The City, through HOME and its Zoning has created Below Market Rate housing which provides options for an individual or family seeking permanent housing in a high cost housing market. The City has supported applications by the ODFC/CoC for rapid rehousing funds. City CDBG funds public services counseling programs which work with those in danger of homelessness and the homeless in finding suitable housing alternatives. Kids in Crisis and Child Guidance Center funded programs address the mental health of homeless youth. CDBG funded programs offer access to food and services freeing up funds for rent.

**Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again**

In a high housing cost area, households and individuals facing a loss of income still need to "make the rent." The services funded through CDBG, like the Food Bank and Senior Prescription Drug Program, assist these families in stretching their resources. There is also the need to increase the number of affordable units, which is done with HOME participation in the creation of affordable housing units. Getting and keeping employment is addressed through personal counseling and job skills training at our shelter facilities. Community Business Development Organizations assist in job creation at the local, neighborhood level. For those impacted by domestic violence, counseling and emergency assistance/shelter is provided by support of the Domestic Violence and Safe House Advocacy.

Agreements between DMHAS and Correction/Court facility result in Shelters being informed of institutional discharge so that people don't just "hit the street."

## **CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)**

### **Actions taken to address the needs of public housing**

In Year 41 SCD staff continued to work with the Housing Authority of the City of Stamford, dba Charter Oak Communities (COC) to assure completion of a project awarded in an earlier funding year, Wormser Congregate (HOME).

SCD is providing COC HOME funds for the development of replacement housing for Czescik Homes at 992 Summer Place. The result will be 48 units deep subsidy (40 one bedroom and 8 studio apartments in a 5 story building.)

COC continues to address the need for tenants to increase income through education, counseling and job training. COC made efforts to assure that tenants participate in a housing self-sufficiency program and to focus on household based economic development. COC staff receives training in their role in Section 504, Limited English Proficiency, and fair housing guidelines.

In YR41 CDBG funds from YR42 were committed to replace windows and install a handicap access ramp for units in COC's Sheridan Mews property. HOME funds will be used for the creation of units at 992 Summer St. The City will provide local capital funds (Housing Development Funds) and a loan from the Commercial Linkage fund for the construction of affordable units in a project known as Park 215 located at 215 Stillwater Ave.

### **Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership**

Beginning with its 2000 HOPE VI grant, COC has provided avenues for tenants to transition to home ownership. This has continued through redevelopment of the Fairfield Court units to Fairgate. COC established building Councils for each of its developments. These Councils review proposed funding of projects that impact their buildings. They were vital in several building renovation projects which involved temporary and permanent relocation of tenants. Now these councils are used as sounding boards for the development of requests for uses of COC capital funds and refinancing. Resident-led initiatives including public housing resident-to-resident community service programs have and will continue to engage residents in activities which improve the quality of life for all residents. Residents become "stakeholders" and participate in public housing revitalization, from planning through operations which strengthens the growth and development of the community. One example is the Vita Health and Wellness district and the development and programming around Fairgate Farm.

### **Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs**

The Housing Authority of the City of Stamford is not a troubled PHA.

## **CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)**

**Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)**

The City uses the HOME downpayment program to provide financing to help low income tenants to become homeowners. The program allows a low-moderate income borrower to purchase a unit they can afford anywhere within Stamford. More importantly, in the Stamford housing market, any unit held for a period of time has historically gained value. A family assisted with a downpayment loan is often on the way to building wealth through equity that will enable even greater housing choice with their next purchase. HOME funds have been used to keep units affordable and safe through rehabilitation. Funds are made available to private property owners and non-profit developers. The City is committed to affirmatively furthering fair housing, including making referrals to counseling agencies to ensure that applicants for assistance will also be successful in obtaining conventional loans. The City works with Realtors and banks to stress the need to provide fair and equal access to conventional financing. The City works with LIHTC projects that by definition provide housing to very low income persons. For example, HOME funds have recently been used in a transit oriented affordable housing rental property. Meanwhile, we will continue to discuss with HUD the limits provided for maximum purchase price/housing value under HOME in a high cost area. The City is reviewing the Inclusionary Housing Zoning regulation to encourage the creation of housing accessible to individuals and families at a lower income level. During the past year the Housing, Community Development and Social Service Committee of the Board of Representatives held a number of meetings to review the Inclusionary Housing Zoning regulation. The City continues to provide tax abatement for affordable housing developments.

## **Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The main obstacle to meeting underserved needs is the continued reduction of available funds. The Community Development Office provides data and information about funding opportunities to local community agencies to help them secure other public and private sources of funds. We have seen a need among income qualified elderly homeowners who are counseled on options for financing necessary home repairs, should they wish to remain in place. If properties are 1-4 units, a HOME homeowner rehabilitation loan will be explored. The City has an "open, rolling" application for this type of assistance. The maximum available per unit is \$20,000, however, repairs in these units often exceed the amount of HOME funds available, or more commonly the value of the property exceeds the maximum HOME property value.

### **Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Health Department issues citations under the City's ordinances, and refers property owners to the LAMPP program for resources to address findings. The City has a "Lead Team." Stamford's Lead Prevention Program is enhanced by the services available through its own municipal departments and via its linkages with various community agencies and programs. Using a coordinated system reciprocal referrals and information sharing with Building, Fire, Social Services and Zoning/Land-use, Stamford has a community network able to address housing related needs. The Health Department offers prenatal and well child care, school and public health nursing, and the Women, Infant, and Children (WIC) nutrition program. As part of the child case management the Environmental Inspections Division confers with pediatricians, clinics and human service agencies to track the progress of each child with lead poisoning. The City of Stamford Health Department has knowledgeable staff that can assist with any questions regarding lead. The Health Department Laboratory Division provides Finger Screening on Mondays and Wednesdays. The Health Department investigates cases of lead poisoned children six years of age and younger with lead levels 10ug/dl or greater. The investigation entails an interview with the family, visual inspection of the premises, and paint chip, soil, and/or dust samples obtained for analysis. If the results indicate lead is present in the home, the owner is responsible for abating the lead using a certified lead abatement contractor to remove the lead to assure proper removal and clean-up. The local health department sends a reminder test letter to parents/guardians for capillary results 5-9 µg/ dl. The level of concern has now been lowered from 10 µg/dl to 5 µg/dl. The new protocol went into effect on July 1, 2013. Any CDBG and HOME funded projects (residential) in pre-1978 structures are tested for lead-based paint hazards. If lead is present the sub-recipient must ensure that lead is abated in accordance with the regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency and in compliance with the Residential Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Title X) and subsequent changes.

### **Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Waterside Coalition, Inc. (CBDO) and the Shelter for the Homeless, Inc. were funded to assist poverty-level individuals acquire the skills they need to expand their employment opportunities. Inspirica was funded to offer families access to programs to develop skills to rise from poverty. A program to help immigrants obtain the necessary documents to establish them as legal workers was funded with the intention of empowering and educating immigrants to ensure they are not abused and have the skills to seek employment. Continued counseling and training of those with low income who reside in Charter Oak Communities associated developments helps these families in increasing their income.

### **Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The City worked with non-profit and other public agencies to implement the community development plan. The City evaluated each activity, and the agencies and organizations, to assess the strengths

and gaps in the delivery system. The City works with ODFC, SFH and Inspirica to achieve a single point of entry into the homeless referral system. The City has worked to restructure the Community Development Office. The Community Development Office communicates with the Social Services Department and Health Department. The HCD/SS Committee held a number of meetings requesting presentations from Land Use and Zoning to gather information to propose changes to local Zoning to encourage the development of "deeply affordable" housing.

**Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

As the emphasis on housing the homeless has increased, there has been a natural growth of cooperation between public and private operators of affordable housing to create workable support/counseling for those obtaining transitional and permanent housing. The City supports these efforts, and urges those with newly funded HOME projects to consider establishing relationships with agencies such as Laurel House to assist tenants to become successful in their new housing. COC has a vibrant partnership with Family Centers, Inc. to connect residents with social services. The City will continue to work with COC on the Vita Health and Wellness district.

**Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)**

Affordability

As noted in earlier narrative, the greatest barrier to affordable housing in Stamford is affordable supply. Market forces have driven property values and rents up; private units are upgraded and rented at higher lease amounts, and sites are difficult to find for new affordable construction as inflated land prices make projects financially infeasible. As possible, the City, through its housing capital funds, assists non-profits in site assembly.

Access

In single family home ownership, a proportionality analysis of HMDA data for the Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk MSA is due for an update. Analysis in 2007 indicated that the percent of total loan originations of white non Hispanic versus other races/ethnicities is somewhat disproportional to applications from

these groups, but loan denials are severely disproportionate to both application levels and loan originations. For example, originations from other races compose 58.9% of all denials, while only composing 35.1% of all originations. Although the CRA data does not provide information showing the relationship of race to income, the significant difference in proportion in this instance makes racial factors and fund access an issue. This data was for the Metropolitan Statistical Area, but there is no reason to believe that Stamford underwriters did not contribute to the disproportionate figures. Stamford's down payment program reaches out to those communities most impacted by these patterns. It is available to applicants who receive home buyer training, and who are tracked through the application/purchasing/financing process by housing counselors who can assure fairness of treatment. In combination with units created through the inclusionary and linkage programs, the City has developed a means of increasing opportunities for those parts of the population that may otherwise be impacted by discriminatory practices. Unfortunately, in Year 41, the revised HUD approved existing housing unit values and income levels mitigated against use of the down payment program.

## **CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230**

**Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements**

HOME Monitoring - We have 20 HOME projects subject to site inspection and review of tenant records. No inspections were required in 2015-2016. A HOME program monitoring log lists all properties, site contacts, date of last inspection and next required date of inspection. HOME regulations require the inspection of units every three years. SCD uses the City Building/Health departments to complete inspections. Tenant records are reviewed for projects in the affordability period. Tenancy reports are due by February; a reminder letter is sent with new HUD income levels and rents. All HOME units reporting are compliant. City staff follows up with non-reporting landlords. Administrative site visits are made to assure compliance. The SCD staff uses a combination of on- and off-site monitoring mechanisms. SCD requires documentation for all requests for payment prior to release of funds. At least two SCD staff members review and approve every request for payment. All work related to construction progress payments are signed off by a project architect and/or City inspector. The site is visited by an SCD staff member, who photographs projects. SCD conducts on-site interviews of workers subject to Davis Bacon wage rates, and conducts desk reviews of certified payroll reports.

For HOME downpayment loans income and property eligibility are reviewed. Before closing, the Health Department inspects for code violations and buyers must address any deficiencies. Newly constructed units must have the City Certificate of Occupancy. Continued occupancy is monitored as part of the mortgage portfolio maintenance process. For example, any notification of payoff, or lis pendens, is used to target the property for additional tenancy evaluation.

CDBG Monitoring - CD staff review the Independent Audits for all subrecipients at the time of application and immediately prior to entering into a contract. SCD staff meet with public service and economic development subgrantees' staff both on-and off-site as needed to review program procedures and accomplishments, and assure accuracy in reporting and timeliness in expenditures. All housing and public improvement activities were monitored on-site. Agencies receiving attention are those who have recently changed key staff and/or must design their own CDBG compliant intake-service client monitoring, for example, economic development recipients. When an agency is selected, their review includes: Adherence to implementation of scope of service in accordance with the executed agreement; Review of unduplicated clients income and race/ethnicity) and intake form providing data; Review of performance measurements; Documentation of request for payments; Record keeping – file retention, availability and accessibility of data. Site visits include interviews with staff and review of service files to assure compliance with low-moderate income benefit requirements and contracting/accounting procedures. No findings were issued in Year 41. A remote monitoring is performed for each Subrecipient Activity Report or Request for Payment. All work related to construction progress payments is inspected by SCD staff and/or City inspectors. SCD staff conduct on-site interviews of

workers subject to Davis Bacon wage rates, and conduct desk reviews of certified payroll reports.

The City of Stamford believes its current affirmative actions in noticing of development opportunities and downpayment assistance under the HOME programs is adequate. The current "use" of these opportunities indicates effective affirmative action. See below paragraphs for minority and women participation numbers as renters and owner/developers.

The City of Stamford, through its Office of Community Development, has an Affirmative Marketing Policy and Procedures statement. There are three sections to the policy: General Information on Fair Housing and Affirmative Marketing Policies, Notices for Targeted Properties, and Special Outreach. The policy was developed to assure that participating landlords, organizations and individuals realize that the City adheres to Federal Fair Housing requirements, and has an affirmative marketing procedure in place. When the City is notified of vacancies, effort is made to assure that individuals who normally might not apply for the vacant rehabilitated units because of their race or ethnicity:

- Are aware of the vacancies
- Feel welcome to apply
- Have the opportunity to rent the units.

The City has established an e-mail listing of agencies which are contacted when a unit becomes available. This listing includes Hispanic, Black and Haitian outreach agencies.

Of the HOME rental units reported on the HUD-IDIS PR 23 for HOME, 25% were Hispanic, and 75% were Black.

Outreach to Minority and Women Owned Businesses: HOME outreach efforts to minority/women developers, investors and companies are consistent with the Minority Outreach Statement presented in the Action Plan's Institutional Structure, in which actions are described to develop and improve the institutional structure impacting housing development and availability.

The principal means of minority and/or women/disadvantaged business involvement in the HOME program are as

- Property owner/developer
- Construction related contractor

The nonprofit rehabilitation project reported completed was done by a minority contractor.
