

Georgia Nugent recently served for 10 years as president of Kenyon College in Ohio. She was a member of Princeton University's first coeducational class, graduating cum laude in 1973, and received a Ph.D. in classics from Cornell University. Nugent has taught at Swarthmore, Princeton and Brown. In 1992, she returned to Princeton as assistant to the president. In 1995, Nugent became associate provost and, in 2001, became dean of Princeton's Center for Teaching and Learning.

Known nationally as an advocate for liberal arts education, Nugent has chaired the boards of the Council of Independent Colleges and Higher Education Resource Services and has served on the boards of the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities and the American Council on Education.

Ms. Nugent will talk about the relationship between civility and the liberal arts, in the historical context of our classical heritage.
