Item 5	<p>This is a request for an additional appropriation of \$500,000 to replenish the salt domes. At the current price of \$77.68 per ton, this appropriation would allow for the purchase of an additional 6,400 tons of salt.</p> <p>At the beginning of the fiscal year we started with approximately 90% capacity (12-13,000 tons of salt) in the domes. Year-to-date, we have used 4.4 tons (over four (4) storms, leaving around 55-60% capacity. Our last purchase of \$375,000 will provide another 4,800 tons or put us back at 90% capacity.</p> <p>The above request will help mitigate the salt needs for the next few storms, but if we incur more than this, we will need to request additional funding to replenish our domes to a moderate level.</p>
